<u>Christmas</u> <u>Tree</u> <u>Appeal</u> we raised £765.60 to provide help for Gaza. Thank you for your donation and support.

<u>Newsletter</u>: there will be no newsletter next week, but normal services will resume on 4 January. Solar Panels: With the Rising Cost of electricity running the parish estate has become very expensive. To make longterm running costs smaller, a large array of solar panels (90 metres square) will be installed on the church roof. The renewable energy generated will power the parish hall and will, it is hoped, offset the cost of energy by up to 60%. Local Energy Scotland, CARES and Scottish Government have given St Patrick's a £32k grant for this £40k project which is being run jointly by the Fabric Group and the Finance Group. The Parish Hall will soon be powered by our own low-cost renewable power - a first for the Archdiocese and if successful may be copied in future years with other projects to power the church building itself and also the chapel house. The parish owes the Fabric and Finance Committees a huge debt of gratitude for their determination over months in pursuing the grant and getting the project off the ground. In time the project will hopefully pay for itself but any contribution towards the shortfall (£8,000) would be greatly appreciated.

FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT SUNDAY SCRIPTURE

[Always read through the scriptures prayerfully before Holy Mass].

Entrance Antiphon

Drop down dew from above, you heavens, and let the clouds rain down the Just One; let the earth be opened and bring forth a Saviour.

First Reading Isaiah 7:10-14

In those days: The LORD spoke to Ahaz: 'Ask a sign of the LORD your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven.' But Ahaz said, 'I will not ask, and I will not put the LORD to the test.' And Isaiah said, 'Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary men, that you weary my God also? Therefore, the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son and shall call his name Emmanuel.'

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 24 R. Let the LORD enter; he is the king of glory.

The LORD'S is the earth and its fullness, the world, and those who dwell in it. It is he who set it on the seas; on the rivers he made it firm. **R**.

Who shall climb the mountain of the LORD?

Who shall stand in his holy place? The clean of hands and pure of heart, whose soul is not set on vain things. **R.**

Blessings from the LORD shall he receive, and right reward from the God who saves him.

Such are the people who seek him, who seek the face of the God of Jacob. **R.**

Second Reading Romans 1:1-7

Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an Apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy Scriptures, concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh and was declared to be the Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness by his resurrection from the dead: Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith for the sake of his name among all the nations, including you who are called to belong to Jesus Christ. To all those in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Gospel Acclamation Alleluia, alleluia!

Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which means, God with us. *Alleluia!*

Gospel Matthew 1:18-24

Now the birth of Iesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to send her away quietly. But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saving, Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.'

All this took place to fulfil what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: 'Behold, the virgin shall conceive and

bear a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel' which means, God with us. When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him: he took his wife.
