**Mass during the 40 Hours':** as you come into church for Mass, you'll notice that the Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the altar.

**At the beginning of the Vigil and 9.30am Masses,** the priest enters the sanctuary in silence, and everyone should kneel. He will then depose the Blessed Sacrament. After this, we should stand for the beginning of Mass. At the end of Mass, after the final blessing, all should kneel in silence as the Blessed Sacrament is placed back on the altar and then remain kneeling until after the priest leaves. We make a good effort to maintain the absolute silence of the church as we leave. **At the 11.30am Mass,** again the priest will approach the sanctuary in silence, and all should kneel. We will have Benediction to finish our 40 Hours' and then the Mass will begin. Once the priest has placed the Blessed Sacrament back in the tabernacle, stand for the beginning of Mass in the usual way. Mass ends in the usual way.

**New lectionaries** on the First Sunday of Advent, we will begin to use a different translation of the scriptures at Mass. This has been mandated by the bishops of Scotland. They have considered a number of translations and, with expert advice, decided that the *English Standard Version* (ESV) is the best one. However, this will mean that we now have to buy new complete sets of lectionaries for use at Mass. The four-volume set for the church is £695 (approx. £175 each). We also need a smaller set for the Mortuary Chapel which is £395 (approx. £100 each) and a processional edition of the Book of the Gospels which is £395. If you would like to buy a volume in memory of a deceased loved one, we will have their name inscribed on the inside. Speak to Father

### **First Reading**                      **Exodus 24: 3-8**

Moses went and told the people all the commands of the Lord and all the ordinances. In answer, all the people said with one voice, 'We will observe all the commands that the Lord has decreed.' Moses put all the commands of the Lord into writing, and early next morning he built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with twelve standing-stones for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then he directed certain young Israelites to offer holocausts and to immolate bullocks to the Lord as communion sacrifices. Half of the blood Moses took up and put into basins, the other half he cast on the altar. And taking the Book of the Covenant he read it to the listening people, and they said, 'We will observe all that the Lord has decreed; we will obey.' Then Moses took the blood and cast it towards the people. This' he said, 'is the blood of the Covenant

that the Lord has made with you, containing all these rules.'

### **Second Reading**                      **Hebrews 9:11-15**

Now Christ has come, as the high priest of all the blessings which were to come. He has passed through the greater, the more perfect tent, which is better than the one made by men's hands because it is not of this created order; and he has entered the sanctuary once and for all, taking with him not the blood of goats and bull calves, but his own blood, having won an eternal redemption for us. The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement and they restore the holiness of their outward lives; how much more effectively the blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God.

He brings a new covenant, as the mediator, only so that the people who were called to an eternal inheritance may.

### **Gospel**

**Mark 14:12-26**

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb was sacrificed, his disciples said to Jesus, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the passover?' So, he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city and you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, and say to the owner of the house which he enters, "The Master says: Where is my dining room in which I can eat the passover with my disciples?"' He will show you a large upper room furnished with couches, all prepared. Make the preparations for us there.' The disciples set out and went to the city and found everything as he had told them and prepared the Passover.

And as they were eating, he took some bread, and when he had said the blessing, he broke it and gave it to them. 'Take it,' he said, 'this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and when he had returned thanks, he gave it to them, and all drank from it, and he said to them, 'This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many. I tell you solemnly, I shall not drink any more wine until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of God.'

After psalms had been sung, they left for the Mount of Olives.
