Palm Sunday is the beginning of Holy Week. It commemorates the triumphant entry of Jesus into the Holy City. Make sure you have a palm, which will be blessed at the beginning of Mass, and one of the booklets to guide you through the liturgy. At the **11.30am Mass**, weather permitting, we will begin in the garden in front of the hall and process into the church with our palms. The reading of the passion happens on this day too at all the Masses - see page 8 in your booklet. The congregation should read out aloud the part marked 'C.'

First Holy Communion, the Presentation of the Our Father will take place at the end of the **11.30am Mass this weekend.** The First Holy Communicants should line up along the altar step after the prayer after Communion. Please be sure to pick up the sheet from the back before Holy Mass begins.

**Flowers** you are invited to donate white lilies in memory of loved ones for Easter. This is a lovely and very generous thing to do, and the donations are appreciated by everyone. Pails of water will be at the back of the chapel if you care to pop them in.

<u>A Lenten Reflection</u> will take place in the hall after Stations of the Cross at **6pm on Monday.** 

Chrism Mass the minibus will leave from the chapel house at **5.15pm on Tuesday.** Each year at the Chrism Mass the priests of the Archdiocese renew their promises before the Archbishop and His Grace blesses the oil of the sick, the oil of catechumens and the oil of chrism for distribution to the parishes. It is a very beautiful liturgy.

'Could you not watch with me one hour?' after the Mass of the Lord's Supper, the Blessed Sacrament will be transferred to the altar of repose in the hall. During the evening, come to spend some time in the quiet with the Lord while He remains in Gethsemane. There will be Compline, which is the night prayer of the Church, at 10.45pm on Holy Thursday Night at the altar of repose in the hall. <u>Good Friday</u> is a day of fasting and abstinence when all Catholics, age and health permitting, are obliged to fast and abstain from meat.

**Divine Mercy Chaplet Novena** begins on Good Friday, after the 3pm Solemn Commemoration of the Lord's Passion and then every morning until Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> April (excl. Sunday) at 10am. This is a good way to commit to the Novena of Prayer leading up to Low Sunday, also known as 'Divine Mercy Sunday.'

Welcome to the Reverend Stephen Jones of the Archdiocese of Oklahoma City and the Reverend Jay Livecchi of the Diocese of Toledo who will be joining us at St Patrick's over the Triduum. Both men are seminarians at the Pontifical North American College in Rome and will be ordained to the priesthood this summer.

Cheese & Wine Reception in the hall will follow the Easter Vigil on Saturday. Come and enjoy all the nice treats that you have missed. Was anyone actually off cheese for Lent?

<u>Wee Boxes</u> today is the last chance to return 'Wee Boxes.' Any donations after today should be made directly to the Scottish Catholic International Aid Fund. Thank you and thanks to our counters for getting all the loose change counted!

# PALM SUNDAY OF LENT SACRED SCRIPTURE

All of the antiphons and readings are in today's special booklet. Make sure you have one of these and a palm before the start of Holy Mass

At the Vigil Mass and 9.30am Mass we will have the Solemn Entrance as per page 4. At the beginning, the priest will process to the balcony, and all should turn and face him for the blessing of the palms and the reading of the Gospel. After the Gospel we will sing *All Glory Laud and Honour* (opposite) as the priest processes to the sanctuary.

At the 11.30am Mass will begin with the Procession that begins on page 2. Gather in the Garden and make sure you have a booklet, a palm, and a copy of the words for the hymn *All Glory Laud and Honour* (opposite).

At all the Masses, the congregation reads aloud the parts marked 'C' in the Gospel and we all kneel for a time at the death of the Lord.

[Always read through the scriptures prayerfully before Holy Mass].

After the blessing of the palms the priest will say 'Let us go forth in peace' and the people reply in the name of Christ. Amen.

We then sing the following as we process. Children should wave their palms during the hymn.

All glory, laud, and honour To thee, Redeemer, King, To whom the lips of children Made sweet hosannas ring.

Thou art the King of Israel, Thou David's royal Son, Who in the Lord's name comest, The King and Blessed One.
