**<u>St Margaret's Pilgrimage</u>** to Dunfermline is on Sunday, 23<sup>rd</sup> June. Leaving at 10.30am. A few seats still available on the minibus.

Scalan Pilgrimage between 1717 and 1799 over a hundred men were trained for the priesthood at the secret college of Scalan in the Braes of Glenlivet. These were the so-called 'heather priests.' The college was even disguised as a farmhouse to avoid detection by the Hanoverian forces. Each year there is a national pilgrimage to Scalan, and we hope to take the minibus from St Patrick's. This year it is on 7 July. More details to follow.

<u>Welcome and Prayers</u> for Ava Grace Flannery who was baptised into the faith of the Church last Sunday.

Asperges at the Sunday 11.30am Masses during Eastertide we will have the Sprinkling Rite at the 11.30am Mass. This takes the place of the Penitential Rite at Mass. The Priest blesses salt and water and sprinkles us with it as a reminder of our baptism while the choir sings the antiphon 'I saw water flowing from the Temple.' The *Gloria* begins after this has concluded.

Penitential Rite at Mass during Eastertide, instead of the *Confetior*, we will have a shorter penitential rite: It goes: Priest: Have Mercy on us, O Lord

# People: For we have sinned against You Priest: Show us, O Lord Your mercy

People: And grant us Your salvation

Priest: May almighty God have mercy on us forgive us our sins and bring us to everlasting life. Amen.

<u>The Apostles' Creed</u> during Eastertide, instead of the usual Nicene Creed, we will say the Apostles' Creed.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting.

Preparing For Pentecost (Sunday, 19<sup>th</sup>

May) The Latin word for '9' is novem. This is where we get the word 'novena' from: it refers to the nine days between our Lord ascending into heaven and the Holy Spirit coming at Pentecost. During those nine days, the Apostles and Our Lady prayed together for the coming of the Holy Spirit. This is where we get the tradition of doing different novenas, nine days of prayer, which we often do for particular intentions. The novena for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Church begins on Friday.

#### Novena for the Gifts of the Holy Spirit

Christ Jesus, before ascending into heaven, You promised to send the Holy Spirit.

Grant us the **Spirit of Fear** of the Lord that we may be filled with a loving reverence towards You.

The **Spirit of Piety** that we may find peace & fulfilment in the service of God while serving others.

The **Spirit of Fortitude** that we may bear our cross with courage and overcome the obstacles that leads to our salvation.

The <u>Spirit of Knowledge</u> that we may know You, ourselves & grow in holiness. The <u>Spirit of Understanding</u> to enlighten our minds with the light of Your truth.

The **Spirit of Counsel** that we may do Your will seeking first Your Kingdom.

Grant us the <u>Spirit of Wisdom</u> that we may aspire to the things that last forever. Teach us to be faithful disciples & lead us in Your ways. Amen.

### SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER SACRED SCRIPTURE

[Always read through the scriptures prayerfully before Holy Mass].

#### **Entrance Antiphon**

Proclaim a joyful sound and let it be heard; proclaim to the ends of the earth: The Lord has freed his people, alleluia.

#### First Reading

Acts 10:25-48

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up,' he said 'I am only a man after all!' Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.' While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.
