


St Patrick's Primary will join us for Mass on the first Friday.

Holy Communion: recently a host was found discarded in the church. By all of us this should be regarded as a serious matter. I have reported it to the Archbishop and have told him that I am sure that it has been an isolated incident. In response, the Archbishop has asked that we, as a parish, make reparation; so, you might consider fasting for a time or doing some other act of penance over the coming days. Then, as a parish, we will say a prayer of reparation together at the Masses over the weekend 14/15 February. While we do not know the motivation for this and we can at least hope that it was done in ignorance, we should all be clear about what the law of the Church says regarding such: 'One who throws away the consecrated species or, for a sacrilegious purpose, takes them away or keeps them, incurs a *latæ sententiæ* [automatic] excommunication reserved to the Apostolic See [...]' (can. 1367). We all have a duty of care for the Blessed Sacrament: if you have any concerns, let the priest know.

Stonework: The work on the stone plinth for the tabernacle, the wall-mounted stone for Our Lady's statue, the refurbishment of the baptismal font, the cleaning of the foundation stone and the repairs to the mortuary chapel stairs is due to begin next Monday, 9 February. It is envisaged that we will have to have Mass in the Mortuary Chapel during the week to let the workmen take possession of the sanctuary.

Solar panel work to supply electricity to the hall; we are hoping this will also start on Monday, 9 February. We have submitted the annual financial return to the Archdiocese; **last year the hall ran at a loss of approximately £14,000** -The majority of costs came from energy usage so it is hoped that the panels will help to offset some of this.

First Reading Zephaniah 3:12-13

Seek the LORD, all you humble of the land, who do his just commands; seek righteousness; seek humility; perhaps you may be hidden on the day of the anger of the LORD.

I will leave in your midst a people humble and lowly. They shall seek refuge in the name of the LORD, those who are left in Israel; they shall do no injustice and speak no lies, nor shall there be found in their mouth a deceitful tongue. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, so that no human being might boast in the presence of God. And because of him you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, righteousness, and sanctification, and redemption; so that, as it is written, 'Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord.'
