Please Note there will be NO Mass this Wednesday at 7pm because on that day we are keeping the timings for the Holyday of Obligation for our parish that are published in the Catholic Directory.

Cemetery Visit from All Souls' Day to 8 November, there is a plenary indulgence for visiting a cemetery and praying for the dead there. The indulgence is granted together with the usual conditions of prayer for the Pope, detachment from sin, confession, and Holy Communion around the time of the visit. You can apply

indulgence to yourself or to the dead. There will be prayers at the cemetery after the 11.30am Mass on Sunday, 5th November. Gather at the priests' circle.

Nine First Fridays' Devotion In 17th-century France, St Margaret Mary Alacoque received a series of visions of Jesus, revealing to her His Sacred Heart which symbolised his love for mankind, and was so often rejected. Jesus made twelve promises to those who attend Holy Mass on 9 consecutive first Fridays of the month; receive Holy Communion & go to Confession: -

- 1. He will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
- 2. He will establish peace in their homes.
- 3. He will comfort them in all their afflictions.
- 4. He will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.
- 5. He will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
- 6. Sinners will find in His Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- 7. Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
- 8. Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.

- He will bless every place in which an image of His Heart is exposed and honoured.
- 10. He will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
- 11. Those who promote this devotion shall have their names written in His Heart.
- 12. The grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in His disgrace, nor without receiving the sacraments.

Five First Saturdays at Fatima Our Lady promised to assist at the hour of death with the graces necessary for salvation all who, as an act of reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, on the first five Saturdays of consecutive months:

- 1. Go to confession.
- 2. Receive Holy Communion.
- 3. Say five decades of the rosary with 15-minute meditation.

Confession can be received within 8 days either before or after the reception of Communion, provided the communicant is in a state of grace for Communion.

[Always read through the scriptures prayerfully before Holy Mass].

Entrance Antiphon

First Reading Exodus 22:20-26

The Lord said to Moses, 'Tell the sons of Israel this: "You must not molest the stranger or oppress him, for you lived as strangers in the land of Egypt. You must not be harsh with the widow, or with the orphan; if you are harsh with them, they will surely cry out to me, and be sure I shall hear their cry; my anger will flare and I shall kill you with the sword, your own wives will be widows, your own children orphans. "If you lend money to any of my people, to any poor man among you, you must not play the usurer with him: you must not demand interest from him.

"If you take another's cloak as a pledge, you must give it back to him before sunset. It is all the covering he has; it is the cloak he wraps his body in; what else would he sleep in? If he cries to me, I will listen, for I am full of pity."

Second Reading 1 Thessalonians 1:5-10

You observed the sort of life we lived when we were with you, which was for your instruction, and you were led to become imitators of us, and of the Lord; and it was with the joy of the Holy Spirit that you took to the gospel, in spite of the great opposition all round you. This has made you the great example to all believers in Macedonia and Achaia since it was from you that the word of the Lord started to spread - and not only throughout Macedonia and Achaia, for the news of your faith in God has spread everywhere. We do not need to tell other people about it: other people tell us how we started the work among you, how you broke with idolatry when you were converted to God and became servants of the real, living God; and how you are now waiting for Jesus, his Son, whom he raised from the dead, to come from heaven to save us from the retribution which is coming.

The second resembles it: You must love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang the whole Law, and the Prophets also.'
