Sanctuary Furniture at the moment, the fabric committee is working hard to secure funding from Historic Scotland to get funds for the repair and improvement of our very special Alisted church building. As you all know, St Patrick's is a building of singular architectural importance in Scotland, but it takes a lot of effort and resources to keep it in good condition and so outside funding is important. As a part of our funding proposal, we want to show Historic Scotland that we wish the building to be as close to the original design of the architects as possible. Before he left, Father Daniel began discussions with the Fabric Committee about the restoration of the original Gillespie Kidd & Coia altar rails that have been stored in the garage since the 1990s. This has now been done and, at some point over the coming weeks, we hope to place them in the church. This will not change the way that we line up for Holy Communion and, if you are unable or prefer not to kneel, there is no problem to remain standing to receive the Host as usual. As well as restoring one of the original features of the church, the rails also have the advantage of delineating the sanctuary from the rest of the church which is a visible reminder to all of us that it is the most sacred part of church where the Lord Himself dwells.

Jeremiah 20:7-9

You have seduced me, Lord, and I have let myself be seduced; you have overpowered me: you were the stronger.

I am a daily laughing-stock, everybody's butt. Each time I speak the word, I have to howl and proclaim: 'Violence and ruin!' The word of the Lord has meant for

Matthew 16:21-27

Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. 'Heaven preserve you, Lord;' he said, 'this must not happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. What, then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life? Or what has a man to offer in exchange for his life? 'For the Son of Man is going to come in
