Asperges at the Sunday 11.30am Masses

during Eastertide we will have the Sprinkling Rite at the 11.30am Mass. This takes the place of the Penitential Rite at Mass. The Archbishop blesses salt and water and sprinkles us with it as a reminder of our baptism while the choir sings the antiphon 'I saw water flowing from the Temple.' The *Gloria* begins after this has concluded.

Penitential Rite at Mass during Eastertide, instead of the Confetior, we will have a shorter penitential rite: It goes: Priest: Have Mercy on us, O Lord People: For we have sinned against You

Priest: Show us, O Lord Your mercy
People: And grant us Your salvation
Priest: May almighty God have mercy on
us forgive us our sins and bring us to

everlasting life. Amen.

The Apostles' Creed during Eastertide, instead of the usual Nicene Creed, we will say the Apostles' Creed. At the 11.30am Mass the Creed is replaced by the confirmandis' renewal of baptismal promises - I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of Heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ, His only Son Our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended into Hell; the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into Heaven, and sits at the right hand of God, the Father almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting.

Scalan Pilgrimage between 1717 and 1799 over a hundred men were trained for the priesthood at the secret college of Scalan in the Braes of Glenlivet. These were the so-called 'heather priests.' The college was even disguised as a farmhouse to avoid detection by the Crown's Hanoverian forces. Each year there is a national pilgrimage to Scalan, and we hope to take the minibus from St Patrick's. This year it is on 7th July. More details to follow.

FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER SACRED SCRIPTURE

Gospel John 10:11-18

Jesus said:

I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep. The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming,

and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep.

'I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep. And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well. They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock, and one shepherd.

'The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again.

No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father.'
