Early Mass during Lent there will be Mass on Mondays at 7.30am in the Mortuary Chapel. This time will suit early risers and workers.

Mass in St Maurice's on Wednesdays of Lent at 12.30pm. Parishioners are welcome to attend.

<u>Early Mass in the School</u> on the Fridays of Lent at 8.30am. Parishioners are very welcome to join the school children.

<u>Friday</u> is the First Friday, a day of special devotion to the Sacred Heart. Primary 2 will be at Mass at 9.30am.

Lent the Church counsels us to use the three spiritual weapons of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Try to come to Mass every day or at least more during the week if you can. We have Stations of the Cross twice per week on Mondays at 6pm and on Fridays at 3.15pm so that the children can come straight after school. There is an earlier Mass at 7.30am on Mondays in the Mortuary Chapel and on Fridays at 8.30am in the school.

Stations of the Cross Plenary Indulgence

Those who pray the Stations of the Cross in a church can gain a plenary indulgence. A plenary indulgence is, we might say, 'time' off purgatory. Because Christ gave the Church the power to 'bind and loose'

(Matt. 18:18), she sometimes attaches this special grace to various actions and prayers. However, there are three conditions: you must go to Confession on or around the time of performing the action, you must be completely detached from sin, and you must pray for the intentions of the Pope (an Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory be). At St Patrick's, we have Stations of the Cross on Mondays at 6.00pm and on Fridays at 3.15pm. You can also come into the church on your own during the day and go round the stations privately yourself. It's a very lovely way to pray more during Lent.

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT SACRED SCRIPTURE

[Always read through the scriptures prayerfully before Holy Mass].

Gospel Mark 9:2-10

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus: 'Rabbi,' he said, 'it is wonderful for us to be here; so, let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain, he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.
