



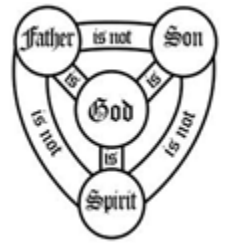

At the beginning of the Vigil and 9.30am Masses, the priest enters the sanctuary in silence, and everyone should kneel. He will then depose the Blessed Sacrament. After this, we should stand for the beginning of Mass. At the end of Mass, after the final blessing, all should kneel in silence as the Blessed Sacrament is placed back on the altar and then remain kneeling until after the priest leaves. We make a good effort to maintain the absolute silence of the church as we leave. At the 11.30am Mass, again the priest will approach the

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY **SACRED SCRIPTURE**

[Always read through the scriptures prayerfully before Holy Mass.]

Entrance Antiphon

Blest be God the Father, and the Only Begotten Son of God, and also the Holy Spirit, for he has shown us his merciful love.

First Reading **Exodus 34:4-9**

In those days: Moses rose early in the morning and went up on Mount Sinai, as the LORD had commanded him, and took in his hand two tablets of stone. The LORD descended in the cloud and stood with him there and proclaimed the name of the LORD. The LORD passed before him and proclaimed, 'The LORD, the LORD, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness.'

And Moses quickly bowed his head towards the earth and worshipped. And he said, 'If now I have found favour in your sight, O Lord, please let the Lord go in the midst of us, for it is a stiff-necked people, and pardon our iniquity and our sin, and take us for your inheritance.'
